THE VOLUNTEERS OF WAGS TO RICHES AWARDED THE REAL HEROES AWARD FOR ANIMAL RESCUE

Excerpts from one of the nomination letters.

Sometimes, in Animal Rescue, you cannot narrow the heroics down to just one person. Especially, when you speak of an animal rescue organization, whose most recognized purpose, is the rehoming of unwanted, unloved and forgotten pets but whose over all goal, is to create a future where animal rescues, are no longer needed.

In the two short years since it's inception, Wags to Riches has not only facilitated the adoption of nearly 900 rescued dogs, but they have gone into the community to spread their message of compassion and responsibility, through education, awareness and action.

Two programs in particular, the Childhood Education program and the Senior Pet Companion Program, are both stellar examples of their efforts to bring awareness and aide, to the canine/human dynamics, of the Yakima Valley.

The goal of every Wags to Riches volunteer, is ultimately, "No More Homeless Dogs". It is an uphill battle, to be sure but in just two short years, close to 900 dogs have found a new lease on life, through the dedicated and committed actions of ALL the Wags to Riches Volunteers, with the 1000th adoption, in clear sight. Their outreach into the community, proves they are proactively devoted to their goal. For them, it is not enough to just rescue and rehome the unwanted and forgotten, but to decrease and ultimately, eliminate the number of unwanted and forgotten, through education, awareness and action.

Nowhere is this more profoundly evident, than with the Merlin Scholarship Fund, which Wags to Riches will be awarding, for the third time this spring, to two, second year veterinary medicine students; one at Washington State University and one at Yakima Valley Community College. These Scholarships are awarded to incredibly deservings students, with the hope that, once they have achieved their DVM degrees, they will give back to their community rescues, by providing low or no cost spay and neuters.

Nine hundred dogs, rescued and adopted. Two scholarshps awarded. Seniors, enjoying pets they may have otherwise, been forced to give up. Children, avoiding dog bites through education and possibly learning a new way of compassion, that will alter their future ways of life. These are phenomenal achievements, made even more remarkable when you factor in the two short years, Wags to Riches has been in existence. No *one* person, can take credit for all this. It was only made possible, through the effective, selfless, oft times exhausting and cooperative coordination of every volunteer, no matter how large or small their contribution.

Wags to Riches is more than just an animal rescue. They are a fiercely devoted group of community members with a single objective; No more unwanted pets, through community education, action and awareness.
