WHAT WE HAVE DONE LATELY!

MERLIN SCHOLARSHIP FUND

Our Scholarship Committee was formed, meetings were held and applications and forms created. They include one \$1,000.00 scholarship to WSU for a student who is at least in their second year of Veterinary Medicine. There are two \$500.00 scholarships to YVCC for students that are in their second year of Veterinarian Technician training. Applications are available thru YVCC or WSU.

It is the mission of the Wags to Riches Scholarship Committee to further the veterinary practices for rescue animals in Washington State.

GUARDIAN ANGEL EMERGENCY MEDICAL FUND

This was formed after trying to rescue two dogs, one who had been mauled by another animal, he died on the operating table. The other had been hit by a car and had to be taken to the after hours clinic, but she was dying by the time we got her there, so she was humanely euthanized. No owners, no one to pay the bills.

We currently have a German Shepherd that is 8-10 years old that has spent many days at the Vet's office under their care and is now in a foster home.

His owner phoned our message line (509-453-4155) and said he had this animal that he couldn't care for any longer and was going to take him to the shelter that night. He went on to say if we wanted him to foster the animal, not to bother calling back. This is an animal that he has had since it was a puppy, but he couldn't give us any time to make arrangements.

As it turned out he couldn't get it into the shelter that night so we had a little time to make some arrangements. Two of our volunteers went and picked him up the next morning. They noticed that he had some sores, but didn't realize the extent until he was seen by a vet. Much of his body had to be shaved because of the sores all over. Some were so bad they had to be sutured. It was clear that he was severely neglected and abused. In spite of it all he has a good disposition. He is not out of the woods yet as our foster continues to care for him under the Vet's guidance.

DOG HOUSES SPONSORED

Wags to Riches has been very fortunate to be able to not only have the use of a piece of property but also loving, caring people to help care for the animals that are placed there. These dog houses really have helped us be able to foster more animals. Yes, we consider this a start to our Sanctuary.

Nine dog houses, so far, have been sponsored, built and placed on this piece of property. Each dog house has a plaque on it with the name of the sponsor. Two of those dog houses will be set aside for only "death row dogs". Those sponsors are Sharon Vetsch (5), Michelle Newhouse (1) The Durant family (1), Sea Galley (1), Teresa Carlson co-sponsor and Ron & Juanda Krebs co-sponsor (1). Each one of these houses represents a saved life and a chance at a new home and a new life.

EDUCATION COMMITTEE

Our Education Committee was formed, meetings are being held and our program is being created.

The mission of the Education Committee will be to focus on the 3 "R"s, 1. Kids Respecting animals 2. Teaching kids that pets are a lifelong Responsibility, and 3. Teaching kids About animal Rescue. We will be working with kids to teach them how to deal with their anger and frustration rather than taking it out on their pets and working with them dealing with the loss of a pet.

Since our first meeting, WSU has provided us with their program that we can use as the bones of our program. This will include working with kids starting at age 1-3.

FOSTER FAMILIES NEEDED

Foster parents provide temporary homes for animals prior to adoption. This is a wonderful and personal way to contribute to saving homeless animals. We provide medical care and food. You provide a safe place. Some pets need a little extra help. Cats often times need to learn to trust and they need the quiet environment of a home. Dogs often benefit from a bit of training. ADOPTIONS-114 LIVES SAVED

Those are great numbers for our short time as a rescue.

If you wonder where the pets come from... We have 2 puppies that were found left in a snow bank. The same day we got a call regarding a little puppy that was left beside a grocery store in the sub- zero weather. Animals left in back yards, on the freeway, dumped where ever and whenever. We have a mamma whose babies all froze to death in an orchard. The stories go on and on.

Our adoptions and transports continue. A couple of weeks ago we did a transport of 9 dogs for Yakima Valley Pet Rescue. Also in that transport were 2 Pygmy Goats. One was pregnant.

VERY Interesting!!!:-)

WAGS IN THE NEWS

We learned first hand (twice in a one month's time) what can happen when an animal is not restrained in a car that is in an accident, and we are trying to get the word out about this danger especially during the Holiday season.

We have partnered with HandicappedPets.com and have a press release regarding safety belts that has gone out nationwide to over 250 contacts, it can be seen on our website.

Dog safety belts do work. Unsecured animals can and do cause collisions. In addition, they become projectiles inside of the vehicle being thrown toward the windshield and, as we know, can be thrown from the vehicle.
